Parents are also granted access to the system through ETLAB app/College website.

8. STUDENT SERVICE FACILITIES

8.1 ADVISORY SYSTEM

Mohandas College of Engineering and Technology has an excellent mentoring system to help the students in their endeavors. The well-experienced faculty mentors act as guides and close enough to elicit key information professionally to show students the right path in all round development. The College implements mentoring of student's right from the first semester until the completion of the programme for their academic, professional, and personal augmentation.

8.2 ADVISOR SUPPORT

The College has a mentorship program “Faculty Advisory System” in every academic year. “Mentor Diary” is maintained to record the students’ details. It is a continuous process where faculty mentors serve as Faculty Advisors to nurture and provide support to the allotted 20 students on average. One of the faculty members of the department is given charge of Staff Advisor. Faculty who are allotted as second-year advisors continue for the same student team throughout the programme. Faculty Advisors take care of all the matters related to academic performance and the personal grievances of every student. They collect all the details, including academic and personal information. This enables the advisor to understand the family, social, economic and academic background, skills, and career advancement. A student record is maintained and a summary of all the activities is recorded.

Advisors assist their students in the following ways:

- Provide academic counselling
- Give personal and professional guidance
- Support students in choosing course work that meets their needs and interests
- Accompany during Industrial Tour and support in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities
- Arrange remedial measures if the student is at risk of failure
- Identify those with learning difficulties and personal problems and advise appropriate action.
- Appreciate the students and parents for their achievements/honours/social commitments.
- Essential counseling is provided to those students with low/irregular attendance, poor academic performance and other reported pitfalls. Further, the academic performance and attendance of very weak students are communicated to their parents over the phone.
- Act as virtual on-campus guardians of students under their Advisorship and visit needy student’s houses, especially during unnatural situations such as flood havoc, illness, death of Parents / injuries etc.
- After every Continuous Assessment Test (CAT), a meeting is arranged together with Faculty Advisors, Parents/Well-wishers and students to discuss the progress of the students.

8.3 COUNSELING FACILITY

Professionally qualified counselor (Female -1) are available from Monday to Friday throughout the academic session. It helps the students to gain the confidence to utilize their full academic and personal potential to achieve goals. Counselors empower them with appropriate attitude & aptitude. Separate counseling rooms are provided in the administrative block. Counselors meet each student by recording the student’s details in their respective registers and case of any special issues, and follow-up is also recorded. The counseling record is kept confidential.

We follow a system of 5 working days a week.

Students will not be permitted to leave the campus between 8.30 am. and 3.30 pm. without the prior permission/sanction of the Director/Principal. If the students leave the campus without permission of the higher authority, the matter will be informed to the parents. If it is repeated a fine will be collected after intimating the parents.

9.2 DRESS CODE

- All students shall dress in uniform with shoes unless specified otherwise
- There may be certain days designated as non-formal days when the students are allowed to come in informal wear. However, clothes worn to college must always be within the boundaries of decency. Clothing must not be revealing, distracting or gang related.
- Identity Cards are issued to the students by the Institute. It is compulsory that students wear their Identity cards visibly when they are inside the campus. Loss of this card must be intimated to the institute office immediately. Students should surrender their ID cards after their course of study in the institute.
- Students are expected to maintain proper grooming standards. Boys should keep their hair neat, tidy and well maintained.

10. GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT

Every student is required to adhere strictly to the code of conduct of Mohandas College of Engineering and Technology as detailed below. To this end, it is necessary that every student understands the rules and regulations framed as part of code of conduct.

- Unauthorized absence from the classes will be taken seriously and disciplinary action will be taken. Sanction should be obtained from the HOD in advance for all absence. If the absence is more than 3 days, medical certificate should be produced. All medical leaves have to be sanctioned by the Director/Principal. Leave application is to be submitted on the day they come back to the college. No late leave will be considered.
- Students, who happen to have no class, are not allowed to loiter around in the campus during class hours disturbing other classes. Abstaining from class “en-masse” is considered as a serious offence for which disciplinary actions will be taken.
- Silence should be maintained in library and computer labs. Library books should be handled with care. Rules pertaining to the issue of library books should be adhered to.

- Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in the college according to the directions of the AICTE and Government of India. Penal measures to those found guilty of ragging will extend up to immediate expulsion from the college.
- Students are expected to maintain a very high order of discipline. No effort shall be spared to conduct themselves at all times, at all places, and on all occasions in a manner worthy of students of a course which is to lead them to shoulder high responsibility in the future.
- Maintain socially accepted standards of morality.
- Don't possess, consume or distribute alcohol, tobacco or harmful drugs (illegal narcotics) on or off campus.
- Show proper respect and courtesy to your fellow mates, teaching and non-teaching staff on or off campus at all times.
- Abide by all the administrative and academic rules of the institute which are already set and put in practice or can be made as and when required, accepting the decision of MCET as final in all respects.
- The head of the institution reserves the right to suspend/ dismiss any student if it is felt that the continuance of the student in the institute is detrimental to the proper functioning / interest of the institute.
- Vehicular traffic is restricted inside the campus. The students using their own vehicles should park their vehicles in the student parking area.

10.1 REPORTING TO COLLEGE/CLASS

The student should report to the class at sharp 8.25 a.m. Latecomers will not be allowed to enter the class and no attendance will be given.

11. HOSTELS

The College campus is designed as a residential educational township. At present the college has hostel facilities for 250 girls and 250 boys which are being enhanced to 400 each. The hostel has warden and resident tutors (RT) for educational guidance. The rooms are large and airy with all the facilities. Mess facilities are available and students can get wholesome, nutritious food of their choice. A homely ambience with rich academic environment is provided. Hostel is a place where students can learn socially acceptable habits and harmonious living. The inmates of the hostel should treat the hostel staff with courtesy and kindness. Inmates have to treat other inmates as their brothers / sisters. Any tendency to hurt others, especially the fresher's, by word or by deed, will invite stern disciplinary action, which may include expulsion from the hostel and from the college. Students should note that 'Ragging' is a criminal offence under law. Inmates should keep the rooms and premises neat and tidy, should cooperate to keep the common areas clean. They should not throw waste outside but leave it in the waste bins provided outside. They are responsible for the furniture in their rooms and other hostel properties.

For the proper running of the hostel a council is formed with the warden as the Chairman and Assistant warden as the convener and Resident tutor and the elected student representatives as the members. This committee will look in to the proper running of the hostel.

11.1 HOSTEL RULES & REGULATIONS

PREFACE:

Mohandas group of Institutions has large number of students coming from various parts of the state. The hostel facilities at the campus are built tastefully to satisfy the personal aspiration of the residents. The hostel is an optional facility offered by the College. Shared rooms in boys' and girls' blocks are available to the students. Dedicated mess facilities are provided to the inmates of the hostel. Only academic and co-curricular activities are permitted in the Hostel. The entire Hostel and mess facilities are under the general supervision of the College administration. A brief description of all the facilities and corresponding hostel rules & regulations are given in the following sections.

ADMISSION RULES:

Application –

- A student seeking admission to the hostel must apply in the application (prescribed format). A passport size photograph must be affixed in the application form along with an undertaking in writing that he/she will abide by the rules of the hostel, duly endorsed by the parent or guardian must be submitted to the Hostel warden.
- Applicants are also required to submit a fitness certificate issued by a Registered Medical Practitioner along with the application form.

Allotment:

- Based on the availability of the rooms and the requirement (twin sharing /Triple sharing) an appropriate room will be allotted by the Hostel Warden.
- Those who wish to avail single room is liable to pay higher fees.
- The College reserves the right to refuse admission in the hostels to any student without assigning any reason, or to expel any resident in the interest and the welfare of the campus.
- A student admitted to the hostel will have no claim to any particular room. He / She will have to stay in the room allotted to him / her with other residents in the room.

PAYMENT OF FEES:

- A student admitted to the hostel for a particular year should pay the fees for the entire period of one semester in advance. The hostel fee is fixed based on an average of expenses and no claim is to be made for any leave or holidays.
- On payment of fees the student is allowed to occupy the allotted room along with the furniture fixtures and other belongings offered by the hostel are then handed over to him/ her and documented.
- Late fee charges will be applicable.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- Inmates of each room are jointly responsible for the furniture, fittings, etc. and cost of repair of any damage to the hostel property is recoverable from them.

- If any student is found absent without proper intimation, appropriate disciplinary action will be taken & immediate information will be given to their Parents / Local guardians.
- Mutual exchange of rooms is not permitted. Students are not allowed to shift rooms without prior permission of the Hostel Warden. For effective utilization of the hostel facilities, students may be required to change their rooms at any time during the academic year if so required and recommended by the College. Students may be asked to vacate their rooms during Semester breaks for undertaking periodical maintenance work.
- Every student is responsible for the care of the hostel property. Students are not allowed to remove any article. Students, staying in the Hostel, are responsible for any loss or damage caused to the property of the Institute whether movable or immovable. Students shall be charged individually or collectively for damages to the hostel property, including furniture, cupboard, etc. provided in the room. If the person(s) is/are not traced, the students in that wing or block will be held responsible and collectively charged. In certain cases, all the students of a particular block may be held responsible. In case of deliberate damage, in addition to recovery of the cost of repair, the Institute may impose a fine and also treat this as a violation of hostel rules. A student vacating the hostel must clear all outstanding payments and get a clearance certificate from Warden as well as College Office before leaving the Hostel.
- Students are not supposed to celebrate any community festival/ occasion like birthday inside the rooms or on the corridors of the Hostel blocks. Open spaces outside the hostel premises may be used for such purposes with prior approval. Celebration must be over by 9:30 pm.
- Ragging in any form and eve teasing is not permitted and any violation of this rule will result into strict disciplinary action resulting in expulsion from the hostel and the Institute.
- No female guest can be entertained in the boy's hostel and no male guest in the girl's hostel room.
- Playing cards or any other form of gambling is strictly prohibited in the hostel.
- Students are not permitted to entertain any day scholars/guests to stay with them without the permission of the resident warden.
- Students are not allowed to stay in the hostel during the college hours without any valid reason/permission from their respective warden / head of the Department.
- Use of drugs, alcohol and smoking is strictly prohibited. Possession of these items in hostel is also prohibited and punishable
- In case of serious illness or infectious diseases, the students should report to the concerned warden for necessary action.
- No electrical appliances are permitted in the hostels.
- All the students have to put off the light & fans of the room when they go out.

- Students are advised to avoid keeping possession of valuables and excess cash with them. They are also advised to keep their belongings or suitcases always locked and deposit excess money, if any, in the bank.
- Writing or pasting posters on the walls, windows and doors is strictly prohibited.
- Hostel inmates shall not organize or address any meeting in the hostel without prior permission of the College authorities.
- Students should not deal with unauthorized vendors.
- Any out-side food is strictly prohibited inside the hostel. In the circumstances of students bringing any kind of food from home, it should be reported to the hostel warden and entered in the register kept for it.
- Strict silence should be observed during the period from 7.00 p.m. to 6.00 a.m.
- Students are not permitted to stay outside the campus at night.
- Students will not be permitted to enter the hostel premises during the college timings.
- If the students wish to go home for weekdays or weekends, they have to obtain permission from their HODs in the prescribed format. In case of student being late to arrive to the hostel after leave due to any exigencies, it should be clearly intimated by the parent to the hostel warden on time
- Disciplinary action will be taken for violation of rules and misconduct by hostel inmates. In all matters of discipline, the decision of the College council shall be final. Student may have no claim on the fees paid if expelled on disciplinary grounds.
- The Hostel organizing body shall be nominated on the basis of merit to assist the Warden in supervision and enforcing discipline.
- The Room of any student can be inspected at any time by Warden/or a team of staff members of the Institute nominated by the Principal / Director.
- Rooms must be locked only by the lock provided by the hostel
- Students are expected to share the responsibilities and duties in maintaining the splendor of Hostel mess and the campus.
- At the time of allotment of seat and leaving the Hostel during vacation, every student must take over and hand over the hostel property including room key carefully. Stolen items, damages of furniture, electric fitting, crockery etc. will be replaced at the cost recovered from the student.
- Activities such as display of notices, cultures, guest artist, publication of souvenirs / magazine whatsoever shall be arranged only with the permission of Principal/ Director.
- Visitors are not allowed after 8.00 p.m. and guests are not allowed to stay in the hostel except with prior permission of the authorities.
- A student suspended from the College on any disciplinary ground will not be allowed to stay in the hostel and has to immediately vacate the hostel.

- Ragging is banned in the campus and anyone indulging in ragging will be punished, which may include fine, suspension from the Institute or class for a limited period, or even expulsion from the Institute. Broadly speaking, ragging is: “any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student”. Any student who is subject to ragging or is aware of any such incident should report the same immediately to
 1. Hostel Warden (Boys hostel)
 2. Hostel Warden (Girls Hostel)

GUESTS AND VISITORS:

- Parents/Relatives are allowed to meet their wards in the hostel only during the non-working hours of the institution with the permission of the Warden.
- No Guest or visitors are permitted to stay in Hostel rooms.

LEAVE OR ABSENCE:

- All residents must obtain an Out-pass before leaving the campus for any reason and shall enter the details in Movement Register before leaving the Campus.
- Students, who are sick and want to go home or to their local guardian, must obtain permission from the Warden in the prescribed form.
- The students are generally not permitted to go to their native place during working days. In case of emergency and other important occasions they may avail leave citing proper reasons to their HODs, through their parents.
- In case of any Emergency (from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m.), the hostel wardens can take decision to send the students to their home, and the same can be informed to the HOD of concerned department on the very next day itself.

HOSTEL MESS RULES:

- Entry into the kitchen is strictly prohibited, except for the Resident Warden and mess committee members.
- Students are required to wear decent attire in the Mess Dining area and shall maintain the discipline.
- Food should not be taken to the rooms, except in case of illness, with the specific permission of warden.
- Complaints regarding the quality of food and suggestions should be entered in the suggestion / complaint register available in the mess.
- Mess timings must be strictly followed.
- Avoid wastage of food and water.

ADDITIONAL RULES FOR GIRL STUDENTS:

- Girl students are not permitted to go out of the campus except with the prior permission of the resident warden.
- Parents / Relatives will be permitted to visit on Saturdays, Sundays and public Holidays between 2.00 p.m. and 6.00 p.m.
- Girl students will be permitted to go out during the weekend or stay outside at night with the local guardian with the written approval of the parents.
- Girl students are especially warned not to keep jewellery or valuables in the rooms.

RULES FOR VACATING / LEAVING THE HOSTEL:

- Students who wish to vacate the hostel are permitted to leave only at the end of semester.
- Students applying for vacating the hostel must take consent of his father/ guardian in writing or by telephonic conversation with warden.
- Hosteller must put up application for vacating hostel giving valid grounds. Application must be submitted minimum one month earlier to the desired date of vacating, but the fee will be charged for the entire period.
- On approval of application, he/she will be issued No Dues Form by the respective wardens for getting clearance from various departments/section.
- After receiving No Dues Form duly completed and clearance from office, the hostellers name will be deleted from the hostel records.
- Failing to adopt above said procedure name of hosteller will continue in the hostel records. He/she will need to pay till the date of submission of complete no dues certificates.
- Application submitted by the hosteller will be considered only if grounds framed in the application are genuine and reasonable then only he/she will be permitted to vacate hostel. Decision of the authorities will be final.
- Students expelled on Discipline grounds will be dealt separately.

OTHER RULES:

- The hostel fee as decided by the management will be applicable for one year (12 months).
- Hostel fee will not be refundable under any circumstances nor can it be transferred to any other name or to any other head.
- Hostel security deposit, as decided from time to time, would be refundable only at the time of leaving the hostel after deducting dues, if any.

- Hostel fee will be charged for one semester (six months) at the time of taking admission in the Hostel.
- The parents of the student will have to give an under taking, at the time of admission to the hostel, that the student will not vacate the hostel for at least 6 months and abide by the rules and regulations.

GENERAL CONDUCT:

- Students shall report to Roll Call daily between 7 p.m. and 8 p.m.
- Utilize the dustbin kept in the corridor for throwing the garbage.
- Keep the clothes, pillows and bedspreads neat and clean. Wash them at least once in a fortnight.
- Use hangers for hanging clothes.
- Do not dry (washed clothes inside the room. Provision to dry the washed clothes is available on the terrace of each hostel.
- Avoid foul smelling items inside your room.
- Ensure that your footwear is clean.
- Do not stick anything on the windows / doors.
- Water and electricity are precious. Avoid wastage of water while bathing and when using the toilet. See that the taps are kept closed after use. All electrical fittings should be switched off while leaving the rooms.
- The students are required to report back to the Hostel by 6.30 p.m.
- During summers as the water level goes down in the campus, water through tankers fulfils the requirements of the campus. Hostel students should not waste the water and should cooperate with the Administration to manage water requirement within a defined time period.
